I bought Jeff Shara's first book in 1996, *Gods and Generals* which is a prequel to *Killer Angels* by his father Michael Shara. We were leaving the next day to go back and see my mother who was not doing well and I took my wife down to a local book store to get her a book. I saw a display with his book and bought it and loved it. I then read *Killer Angels* and now have 16 of Jeff's 18 books.

Technically they are novels. The history is as accurate as Jeff could make it. He picks 4 or 5 key persons involved in the story and switches from one to another telling the story as they saw it from their knowledge and point of view as the story progresses. You feel like you were there with them. One of my most favorite authors.
